The happy memories and enjoyment I experienced during that time compelled me to return, so I volunteered again this year from March 18th to 23rd, 2024. Upon arrival, I was warmly welcomed and shown to my lovely accommodation, where I later joined everyone for lunch.

Settling into my accommodation was easy, as was meeting the children, caregivers, and teachers. Language was not a problem, as everyone spoke English, although my Scottish accent did raise a few laughs!

The love and care given to the children by all the staff members was evident from the early hours of the morning until the end of the day. A program of activities was drawn up for me, including reading classes with children of all ages. I found that the younger children particularly enjoyed having me read to them, often asking for the same book repeatedly. Additionally, I assisted in pushing wheelchair-bound children to the dining room and feeding those who were unable to feed themselves. Spending time with non-verbal wheelchair users was another way of showing love and care. I also enjoyed playing games with the younger children, although I couldn't quite keep up with their speed!







I was thoroughly entertained by all the children at the village, with their singing, dancing, laughter, and their inclusivity towards me in all their activities. Having volunteered in other countries, I found Chosen Children remarkable in its operation. The caregivers and teachers truly care, as do the children who help look after their less fortunate brothers and sisters.

I am grateful for the opportunity to have volunteered at Chosen Children Village and for the many fond and happy memories I have from my time there. I often think of those still at the village and hope they are all well. I would love to return and stay a little longer next year.

Special thanks go to Leny, the Program Director, Doc Obet, and Jen for making me feel at home so quickly and for all their hard work. 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
